

Jesus is the Reason for the Season: Christmas in words and pictures

It used to be that Sundays came around quickly, then it was months and now it's Christmas! Sadly, this will be my 10th and final Christmas in Shoreham ... as we leave for pastures new in February. To that end, please note that the current church email address revdrdi@outlook.com will be switching to shorehamparish@gmail.com. For now you can use both but the Outlook account will be closing at the beginning of February.

The title for this article is one of the rather corny slogans, used in years past, to challenge us to think a bit more about the meaning of Christmas. Others include:

Christmas - copyright: it's not a genuine Christmas without Church Put Christ back into Xmas Give Jesus your Christmas Presence - Deliver it yourself Make Room for God this Christmas (alluding to the failure to make a hotel reservation in Bethlehem) and then there were some rather startling ones: You're a virgin, you've just given birth and now three kings have shown up Spoiler Alert. He Dies.

Christianity could be regarded as a religion of words. The library of 66 books, that we call the Bible, have around 750,000 words in them. Sermons are preached, prayers are prayed, the poetry of the liturgy is read. Words. Modern and ancient. Words can be wonderful but they are not the whole story. Images are important too. Churches are sermons in stone, paintings and windows, creeds and stories, in glass and on canvas.

There is one image, an African painting of Jesus and Mary, that I saw in Nazareth many years ago. It was one of many paintings in this church, from all over the world, depicting Mary and the infant Jesus. As I think about the baby Christ we celebrate at Christmas, it is to this image I return in my mind.

It was a simple painting. Black, white and red. Mary is standing and holding the baby in such a way that he is facing us with his arms spread out, with the back of his wrists against her shoulders. Uncomfortably reminding us that one day this child will be on the cross. It is as if Mary is offering him to us, as if she saying, 'This is God coming into the world, to keep us company in all the world's pain. This is the "Word" made flesh who brings the good news of God's love.'

Whatever it is, an image, some words or music that makes you pause this Christmas, I pray that you may find a moment of hope, filled with joyful calm and remember those words, spoken to Mary and to us: 'Do not be afraid. For I am with you'. Emmanuel, God is with us.

NEWS FROM SHOREHAM VILLAGE SCHOOL, NOVEMBER 2024

I am very proud of Seb, Imogen and Daisy, who represented the school at the Remembrance Service in the church and at the war memorial. Seb and Imogen read poems they had written in class, following an inspirational Creative Writing workshop led by pupils from Sevenoaks School. Daisy and Imogen then laid the school wreath on the war memorial before the minute's silence was observed. All pupils were able to show their respect during an assembly in school on 11th November, led by Reverend Diane. It is very important to us that our pupils understand these significant cultural events and that they can participate in them as part of the heart of our village community.

Cameron Class enjoyed their trip up to Shoreham Station to see the finished mural that they contributed to and it was very exciting to spot the individual pieces of art with the children's first names underneath. It is a joyous celebration of the beauty of Shoreham! The children were invited to suggest further ideas to improve the station and also had the opportunity to ask questions of the Southeastern and Station Manager guests. They asked some thought-provoking questions!

Our anti-bullying ambassadors have been busy preparing and delivering an assembly, reminding everyone in the school of how important it is to understand what bullying is and to tell someone if you feel you are being bullied. We reminded everyone of our Shoreham High Five (using the five fingers / thumb on our hand):

1. Ignore it 2. Talk politely 3. Walk away 4. Talk firmly 5. Report it

Bullying, if it occurs, is always dealt with swiftly in our school and it is really important that the children tell us so that we can help to resolve any issues.

The conversion process for us joining The Pioneer Academy is progressing and we have a conversion date of 1st February 2025 planned. We do not expect there to be any noticeable changes initially when we join on 1st February but do anticipate some capital investment in the fabric of the school and grounds to happen at some point. We are very grateful to Pioneer for facilitating the purchase of some really lovely, substantial furniture for the Palmer Class outside area which includes story chairs, planters, tuff trays, storage and some lovely work units for messy play.

If you would like to support the school further, we are always happy to hear from people who would be interested in volunteering to work with the pupils to hear readers or run a club, or for those who could bring skills to the Governing Body that will help to lead the school strategically to further improve. If you would like to find out more about how you can help your village school in this way, please contact me via the school office; all volunteers are subject to a Disclosure and Barring Service Check and go through an induction and training programme.

Yes, it really is that time of year again! Signs of Christmas are everywhere. Most importantly, Santa's elves have been in touch with the Shoreham Society to arrange his annual trip to see the children of Shoreham. We are thrilled that, as before, he has agreed to come

on Christmas Eve. It is also wonderful that the Samuel Palmer Pub has offered to host this great event. It is a little earlier this year, 3pm until 3.45.

This is a free event for all Shoreham children and those that are here for Christmas. Last month, the Committee discussed **traffic** related issues – problem parking, yellow lines and visitor numbers. No easy solutions, but we agreed that something must be done and that a report commissioned by the Parish Council is welcome. Parking on the George Bend must be dealt with and we are concerned about antisocial parking on the High Street pavement either side of Mill Lane. It is possible to park on the curb while leaving space for buggies and wheelchairs, but often the pavement is all but blocked, forcing pedestrians into the road,

However, there is some good news! We are told the use of the **train** at Shoreham Station has increased by 30% over the last two years. This is in part thanks to people coming down from London to visit The Mount Vineyard – so not everyone needs to come by car.

There is a new way of getting up to date train information – Southeastern has a WhatsApp service on 07866 002 690.

We've arranged a **Public Meeting with a talk on 'Digging in the Darent Valley'** – all about local archaeological discoveries over the last five years. It's **on Friday 29th November at 7.30 in the Village Hall**. We know that our wonderful distributors often deliver your Gazette a little before the beginning of the month, so hopefully you'll read this before then. Anne Sassin, the Community Archaeologist of the Darent Valley Landscape Partnership Scheme, will tell us what has been found and what it tells us about the past. It's also the Shoreham Society's Annual General Meeting, and we'll again welcome William Alexander of Castle Farm talking about his farming year.

Finally, we are keen to find a new membership secretary to replace the wonderful Jenny Walkling who is standing down after many years of service. Duties are modest and there will be plenty of support. Please get in touch if you could help! Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year to all.

WINTER BERRIES: A SEASONAL FEAST FOR WILDLIFE

Winter berries bring vibrant colour to hedgerows and woodlands while offering a critical food source for wildlife through the colder months. These berries, ripening in autumn, vary in how long they last into winter, with some enduring until February, depending on the species and the feeding patterns of wildlife.

Remarkably, birds appear to follow a careful strategy when consuming winter berries, selecting them in a sequence that extends their food supply. Early in the season, birds prioritise non-toxic berries with shorter shelf lives, like blackberries. Berries that are mildly toxic or longer-lasting, such as ivy berries, are saved for later, only eaten when other foods are scarce. Even then, birds eat these in small amounts to avoid toxicity, helping to ensure that food supplies stretch into late winter.

Three striking wild berries to spot in winter

- 1. **Hawthorn** The deep red berries, known as haws, are a lifeline for birds like thrushes, blackbirds, and redwings. Found in hedges and woodlands, hawthorn adds vibrant pops of colour in winter. They can be used to make jellies, wines and even ketchups!
- 2. **Holly** With its glossy evergreen leaves and vibrant red berries, holly is an iconic winter plant. Its berries provide essential nourishment for birds during the colder months, and mistle thrushes are known to fiercely guard these berries to keep them all to themselves! Small mammals, like wood mice and dormice, also benefit from this winter snack. However, holly berries are toxic to humans and pets, so it's best to admire them as festive decorations rather than a treat.
- 3. **Rowan** Also called mountain ash, the rowan's red-orange berries are a favourite for fieldfares and waxwings. The berries are sour but safe to eat and rich in vitamin C. Rowans often grow in open areas, lighting up the landscape even on the greyest winter days.

For a nature-friendly winter walk, keep an eye out for these wild winter jewels, and the animals feeding on them.

The Parish Council met in October and November and Members were pleased to welcome residents as well as our County and District Councillors to the meeting.

The following issues were discussed:

- Parking Survey Cllrs Histed and Jeffery met with the consultants, ITS Global, following their initial report. They are making some amendments to the plans and the Parish Council will be holding a public meeting in the new year for residents to review and comment on the proposals.
- Refuse Freighter the Parish Council has renewed the contract with Sevenoaks District Council for the Saturday refuse freighter and as soon as the new schedule is published, it will be made available.
- Members agreed with the Cricket Club that the advertising banners would be removed during the off season and these have now been taken down.
- CCTV the CCTV in the Recreation Ground has been repaired following two incidents of vandalism. Kent Police are continuing their investigations into these crimes. The cost of the repairs was covered by a grant.
- Remembrance Sunday The Parish Council would like to thank all those who contributed to such a successful Remembrance Sunday this year. Cllr Jeffery who organised for the Shoreham Cross to be re-chalked and all the contractors involved, the master craftsmen who restored the War Memorial and re-etched the name on the plaque. They all worked extremely hard to get everything completed before Remembrance Sunday. Special thanks to Cllr Blamey and his team of volunteers who organised the road closures to allow for the safe procession from the Church and observing of the two minute silence.

The Parish Council will be producing a Christmas Newsletter to go on social media and the Council's website. There will be some paper copies available in public places. If you would like a copy please email the Clerk at clerk@shorehamparishcouncil.gov.uk.

A full pack of information supporting each meeting is available for residents to download from the website. Before every planning meeting, the planning log is uploaded which includes information on past and current applications. The next Council meeting will be on Wednesday 22 January 2024.



SHOREHAM & DISTRICT HISTORICAL SOCIETY

For our November meeting, Alan Williams gave a fascinating and well-attended talk about the V1 flying bombs - the "doodlebugs" - that rained down on London and the south-east for three months in 1944. Many were launched from moveable platforms in northern France and caused enormous turmoil. More than 1,400 landed in Kent, killing 150. One exploded near the centre of Shoreham, just to the north of Water House.

There will be no December meeting of the Society as it was not well supported last year with several other Christmas meetings on offer at that time. The next meeting on 17th January will be the Bill Lothian Memorial Lecture when Anne Nicholl will talk on "My Father, an Army Doctor in WW2".
